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PUBLIC NOTIFICATION – February 7, 2020

Dr. HERAR, Daljit Singh Abbotsford, BC

1. **Nature of action:** The Inquiry Committee of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC (the College) conducted an investigation into the conduct of Dr. Daljit Singh Herar under section 33(4) of the *Health Professions Act*, RSBC 1996, c.183.

The Inquiry Committee and Dr. Herar have agreed to resolve all matters arising from the investigation by way of a Consent Agreement under section 37.1(3)(a) of the *Health Professions Act*.

2. **Effective date:** January 30, 2020
3. **Name of registrant:** Dr. Daljit Singh Herar
4. **Location of practice:** Abbotsford, BC
5. **Admission and acknowledgements:** Dr. Herar has admitted and/or acknowledged that he breached the following conditions, which had been imposed on his practice:
 - a. That he see no more than 40 patients per day;
 - b. That he practise only six days a week;
 - c. That he notify all physicians and clinical staff at his practice locations of the terms and conditions of his practice in a form acceptable to the College.
6. **Disposition:** Following the issuance of a disciplinary citation pursuant to section 37 of the *Health Professions Act*, Dr. Herar entered into a Consent Agreement with the Inquiry Committee of the College, wherein he has consented to the following terms, pursuant to section 37.1(3)(a) of the *Health Professions Act*:
 - a. To remain on the Conditional – Disciplined class of registration;
 - b. A formal reprimand;
 - c. A fine in the amount of \$40,000;
 - d. A suspension from the practice of medicine for one day on February 25, 2020;
 - e. Costs of \$10,000.

7. **Rationale:** The Inquiry Committee was critical of Dr. Herar’s breach of his practice conditions. Given the importance that must be placed on physicians to comply with conditions placed on their practice by the College, the Inquiry Committee determined a disciplinary outcome was appropriate.

The College of Physicians and Surgeons is the licensing and regulatory body for all physicians and surgeons in the province. Governed by provincial legislation, the College’s role is to protect the public by establishing, monitoring and enforcing high standards of qualification and ethical practice across the province.
